# Data Protection and Investigations I

- Data protection 'Code of the Road' for processing information about people
- Data protection is about...
  - protecting people
  - Having good reasons for doing what you do
  - -being transparent about what you do
  - -being accountable for what you do



## Data Protection and Investigations II

Article 8 Charter of Fundamental Rights of the EU Protection of personal data

- 1. Everyone has the right to the protection of personal data concerning him or her.
- 2. Such data must be processed fairly for specified purposes and on the basis of the consent of the person concerned or some other legitimate basis laid down by law. Everyone has the right of access to data which has been collected concerning him or her, and the right to have it rectified.
- 3. Compliance with these rules shall be subject to control by an independent authority.

# Data Protection and Investigations III

- Disclaimer: this is about rules for EU institutions, national legislation may differ slightly
- Lawful basis? Your investigation powers
- Informing suspects? Deferral may be possible
- Access to own personal data? Possibility to defer/restrict for protection of investigation or third persons
- Rectification? Possibility to provide observations



# Data Protection and Investigations IV

- Data quality? "adequate, relevant and not excessive; correct and up-to-date" - make sure it's correct, take only what you need
- Conservation period? As long as necessary, as short as possible
- Accountability? Document what you're doing and why you're doing it
