CONCLUSION

Eurojust/Frontex/OLAF and Europol will **never** be 'big' on Social Media

Why?

- Too difficult/dangerous to interact directly with citizens
- Too little information of direct relevance to citizens for their everyday lives
- Too few resources to maintain the services



- Social Media presence is part of modern day communication
- Websites will remain the key information source
- 'Social Media Strategy' (incl. content plan, security and IT policy and social media guidelines for staff and Community Managers) in Autumn 2012
- Using Facebook/LinkedIn, YouTube and Twitter from January 2013
- Careful approach with minimal resources
- 1.5 FTE (Community manager, content creation, AV support and editing/proof-reading)



What can we achieve from the use of Social Media?

- Show that we are not living in the past
- Expand the reach of our Press Releases
- Ability to target some of our communications
- Ensure the organisation's visibility and increase awareness
- Incorporate videos, speeches, interviews
- Drive new visitors to our corporate website



More than 60% of journalists use social media to find new ideas for news articles.


9/10 journalists use social media at the office


Total figures for Social Media Jan-April 2013



Media reports 2013: Jan-Apr.






Total up to Apr. 2013: **36,636**

- Worldwide access to other criminals




Members of Koobface





- Koobface: Gang from Skt. Petersburg behind an internet worm which spread via Facebook and other social networks.
- Gained control of hundred of thousands of computers. They used bogus links to online videos which masqueraded as a Flash update.
- The gang made about 2 million USD a year.



Cyber-criminals steal identity of one of the world's top security chiefs using Facebook

The head of Interpol has warned that cyber-crime is the 'most dangerous criminal threat we will ever face' after fraudsters stole his identity on Facebook.

Security chief Ronald K. Noble revealed that two fake accounts were created in his name and used to find the details of highly-dangerous criminals.

The embarrassing security breach saw one of the impersonators used the false profile to obtain information on fugitives convicted of serious crimes including rape and murder.

Your hardware used for distribution of pirated software will be confiscated and you will be arrested, charged and convicted for up to 5 years in prison time and registered as a thief for the rest of your life.

To help you make your payment faster and totally anonymous to you, we decided to accept vouchers that are spread nationwide and can be purchased in all major stores.

EU Legislation p. 163.1 (3) Every person who transmits, makes available, distributes, sells, advertises, imports, exports or possesses for the purpose of transmission, making available, distribution, sale, advertising or exportation any illegal software files is guilty of an indictable offence and liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding ten years and to a minimum punishment of imprisonment for a term of five years.
